

Sanjeev Bhalla is a Professor of Radiology at Washington University's Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology (MIR) in St. Louis, MO, USA. Bhalla completed his university training at Yale University in 1990 and Columbia University of New York in 1994. His Radiology residency at MIR was from 1995-1999 and in 1999, he was chief resident with Christine (Cooky) Menias. After finishing his fellowship in Cardiothoracic Imaging, he stayed at MIR and in 2007, became section chief of Cardiothoracic Imaging.

He has coauthored over 150 peer reviewed papers. He is most proud of his educational achievements. He has won many teaching awards at MIR, including outstanding teacher in 2003, 2007 and 2015. In 2012 he was recognized as outstanding clinician at Washington University. In 2021 he was named the ARRS Outstanding Educator and the AUR chief resident's outstanding Educator.

He is a current member of the Fleischner Society and the current President of the Society of Thoracic Radiology. He also serves as the Cardiopulmonary Trustee for the American Board of Radiology and is a Board member of the Radiologic Society of North America (RSNA).
