

Matthew S. Parsons, MD, is a Professor of Radiology at Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology (MIR) at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, where he has won numerous teaching awards. Dr. Parsons is also the neuroradiology fellowship director at the Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology, one of the largest programs in the United States. He is the Head and Neck imaging Director and the Neuroradiology Quality and Safety Officer. He possesses a strong affinity for spine imaging as well. A MIR graduate, Parsons completed a neuroradiology fellowship following a diagnostic radiology residency at Saint Louis University. His research interests include brachial plexus imaging, various head and neck radiology topics, imaging appropriateness, and cost-effective imaging. He served in the United States Army Reserves for 15 years, with multiple deployments to combat zones.

Parsons is a member of several professional organizations, including the Radiological Society of North America, the American Society of Neuroradiology, the American Society of Spine Radiology, the American Society of Head and Neck Radiology, and the American College of Radiology. He earned his medical degree from the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine and his bachelor's degree from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.
